Tiny Porch Concerts Teams with National Park Service for Free Concert Series

(Westlake Village, CA) In cooperation with the National Park Service, which is celebrating its 100th birthday this year, Tiny Porch Concerts will be presenting a series of free, summer concerts at the Peter Strauss Ranch.

According to the concert promoter Mike Corridori, “Each month, June through September, we will offer new musical talent at the intimate, iconic Peter Strauss Ranch, which is now part of the National Park Service. It will be like a smaller, rustic version of the Hollywood Bowl without the traffic and with plenty of free parking.”

The concerts are scheduled for May 8, June 12, July 10, August 20, and September 10. Each Tiny Porch performance will be free to the public, who will be encouraged to bring their own blankets or low-back chairs, picnic during the concerts, and explore the Peter Strauss Ranch. In addition to the concerts, Tiny Porch will feature a Mountain Jam Workshop before each main show to allow guests to bring their own instruments and get pointers on “jamming” from local musicians.

Corridori notes, “The community will enjoy original, high quality entertainment in an outdoor amphitheater, under the shade of giant oaks. It’s unique, cozy, and an amazing way to enjoy great music that you would normally have travel some distance to see. The ranch is easily accessible, yet, tucked away in the beautiful Santa Monica Mountains off Mulholland Highway in Agoura Hills.”

Tiny Porch Concerts was established specifically as a non-profit to promote all types of live, original music at unique, rural settings, creating a cultural experience, while giving back to the community and providing some financial support to the artists and the National Parks. The concerts also serve as a means to help educate the public on the work done by the National Park Service in outdoor recreation, conservation, and historic preservation.

Concert goers are being encouraged to make donations, which will help allow the concerts to continue. Local businesses and organizations are being offered sponsorship opportunities that include advertising in the printed, souvenir concert programs, flyers and other marketing materials, and on special VIP Season tickets. Reception sponsorships are also available to area restaurants, breweries, wineries, distilleries, bakeries, and other food and beverage companies.
